CAM "complementary alternative medicines."

- Natural products
- mind-body therapies
- Alternative (chinese, Ayurvedic, natural, spiritual)

People using these methods present later - do not go to conventional medicine as early.

this has become a policy issue in Malaysia.

20 interviews, semi-structured. Malay, Chinese, Indian  
Patients often just didn't realise a symptom indicated cancer.

Patients fear disapproval or blame from doctors if they discuss CAM treatments.

Patients enthusiastic about having CAM therapy administered in hospitals alongside conventional therapies.

this might prevent patients from seeking outside treatments?

Can we educate physicians more on the efficacy of combining alternative medicines with traditional therapies?



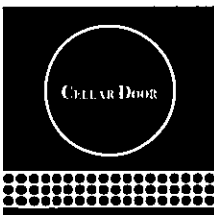

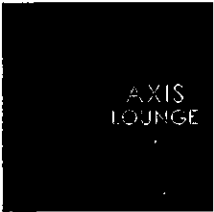

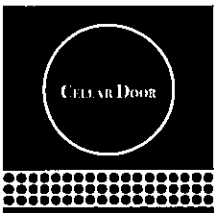

Dr. James Lashin: Quality of Life, physical activity and Fall  
Risk in Elderly Lao - working in Thailand and Laos.

Increase in urbanization  
Increase in urbanization in Laos. Growing ageing population. Little is  
known about it. There is a movement from infectious disease to chronic,  
preventable diseases, e.g. diabetes, heart disease.

Focus on Don Cheng province. How does health care interact with  
the rest of the social structure? Team of 8 nursing students.

Questionnaire from Lao ministry of health. Interest in physical  
activity. Adapting US risk assessment tools to Thai/Lao context.  
Volunteers trained and practiced interviewing. They surveyed  
400 people. Non-systematic "sample of convenience." Bias  
toward people who were out and about. 20% of these individual  
people had fathers. Need to develop more of this survey, expanded to  
broader sample of population.

Social changes mean more elderly people are being "abandoned" in  
elder care facilities.

## Conservation of Siamangs

- Apes sensitive to small disturbances
- Dependent on closed-canopy forest
- Very slow reproducers
  - cannot handle hunting pressure
- Endangered as of 2008
  - Most surveys in Sumatra, few in Malaysia

## Research goals

- Analyze forest loss
  - Develop estimates of population sizes
    - listening to singing groups
  - Experimenting w/ citizen science
  - Train Malaysian grad students
  - Develop action plan
  - Forest loss
    - 33% of Siamang habitat completely lost
    - Remaining forest is degraded
    - Only 22% of habitat is protected
- ~ 140,000 individuals in Malaysia

### Use of Fire in Cambodia

- Seasonally flooding of major lake
- Fish are a major cultural food source
- Biosphere managed by UNESCO
  - Tonle Sap Biosphere protected in Cambodia
  - Major biome changes from dry to wet season
  - Local economy maintained by subsistence harvesting
  - Tourism growing
- Major wild fires broke out during El Niño year.
  - Economy still not recovered
  - Lack of fire prevention planning focus on fire suppression

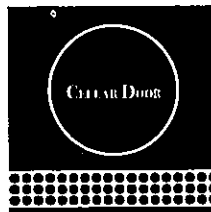

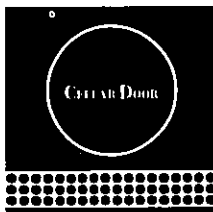

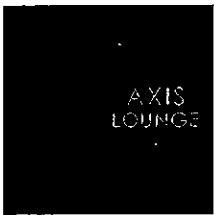

"Dangdut is the Music of My Country" - Andrea Decker

- Dangdut - most popular music of Indonesia
- murky origins
- uses Kendang drums - distinctive rhythms
- low class reputation but wildly popular
- (played pop music video 1) - "it's irresistible for dancing"
- male audience - "Dangdut is exploitative to women's bodies" - scholarly opinion
- Indonesian interviewees don't think so
- main audience of Dangdut shows - older women
- (played pop music video 2) - more conservative
- Guiding Ideas; music prescription tied to pleasure, gender fandom

"Keroncong: Keeping Traditions Alive" - Hannah Standiford

- Keroncong; ~~musical~~ instruments similar to ukuleles, introduced by Portuguese, known as nostalgic music
- Assumed nationalist tone during Indonesia's struggle for independence



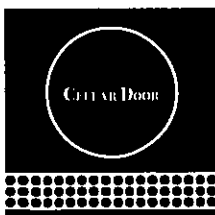

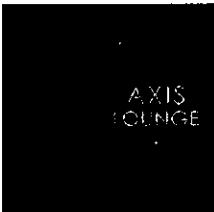

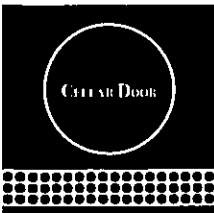

- Rule; don't do any alternative history, all angles & experiences must be perfectly aligned



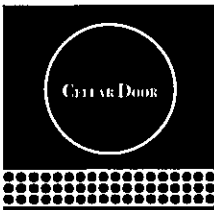
